












What is CeGIDD?

You're at CeGIDD, the HIV and STI screening Center. It's a free service to screen HIV, viral hepatitis and STI that is confidential if you wish it to.

CeGIDD is:

- Information and counseling
- Screening
- Vaccination against : Hepatitis A (VHA), hepatitis B VHB), papillomavirus (HPV), Monkeypox
- PrEP



Doctors provide consultations on indicated schedule. If the doctors deems it necessary, he can prescribe screening test and/or treatment.

The nurse welcomes you, explains the conduct of the screening and carries out the samples according to the medical prescriptions. She sets an appointment for the rendering of your results, which will be given to you personally, on presentation of your anonymity number or your ID.

Prevention advices could be given to you, as well as condoms for male and/or female.

The nurse is also present to answer any questions or concerns.

If your last transmission risk situation virus goes back less than 48 hours, a post-exposition treatment could be suggested.

In case of the result being positive, treatment could be delivered. If medical monitoring is required, you will be oriented to a doctor specialized in VIH and chronic viral hepatitis care.

CeGIDD is also a vaccination point against multiple STDs.

CeGIDD offers the PrEP as well, which is a pre exposition treatment. It can be prescribed to prevent VIH infection in some cases.
